Horse show regulations for anyone on the grounds of HHF

- All accounts must be settled at the show. There will be a \$25 surcharge added for checks returned by the bank. A billing charge of \$25 will be added to any accounts not settled in full at the show. Please make checks payable to "Hasty Hills Farm, Inc."
- 2. Hasty Hills Farm Inc., Horse show management, organizers, owners, and their employees take no responsibility for loss, injury, or damage to horses, exhibitors, equipment and anyone or thing connected hereto.
- 3. The ring will be available for ticketed schooling the day prior to the show, beginning at 1pm. Day of, the ring will be available for controlled schooling until 30 minutes before the show starts. Riders must wear a number while schooling. The indoor arena will be open all day for riding, lunging, and schooling.
- **4.** A current negative coggins is required for all entries, as well as rabies, flu/rhino and strangles vaccines.
- 5. Non-refundable stall fees are due the Wednesday before each show.
- 6. Horses that school and do not show are responsible for a schooling/grounds fee.
- 7. ASTM/SEI approved and fitted riding helmets must be worn while mounted.
- 8. The management reserves the right to divide any classes where the number of entries warrant an to combine/cancel any classes with fewer than three entries.

GVBA SHOW INFO

GVBA Classes: For entries in this Division, every owner must be a 2022 member of the GVBA. The membership fee is \$35.00. The membership fee may be enclosed with the completed entry form. The GVBA is a not for profit organization founded by Mrs. Herbert Wadsworth in 1913 for the purpose of promoting and supporting the breeding and development of thoroughbred and thoroughbred type horses. Information about the organization and its history may be found on the GVBA website which includes information on a member discount for veterinary services at Cornell Veterinary hospital.

Payment for entries must be made to Hasty Hills Farm. In order to qualify for prize money, every horse entered in this division must have been bred and/or foaled in the 31 western counties in New York, which is the territory of the GVBA. Exceptions to this requirement are limited to thoroughbreds that have raced, and broodmares in Class 101 that have either been bred in 2022 in the 31 counties of the GVBA or have a foal at foot that was born in the 31 counties of the GVBA. Horses or ponies shown in the Junior Handler Class 106 may be of any breed and foaled anywhere. Entry fee per class, per horse is \$25.00. Entry fee in the Junior Handler class is \$15.00.

Horses placing either first or second in any class (except Junior Handler) qualify for the Championship Class. There is no entry fee for this class. Champion and Reserve ribbon awards for this class Six ribbons and prize money awarded in every class except the Junior Handler class and championship. Six ribbons and Gift Certificate to the winner of the Junior Handler Class. Prize money is: First place \$150.00, Second place \$125.00, third place \$80.00, fourth place \$50.00, fifth place \$20.00, sixth place \$10.00.

The horse show reserves the right to combine or divide any class or classes depending upon the entries. **Foal** class will be offered if entries warrant.

GVBA Rules - Please Read - Thank You!

State of New York Department of Agriculture and Markets PART350

-STANDARDS OF CONDUCT FOR FAIRS-

350.9 ownership of exhibits entered infairs and shows.

- (a) Ownership must be entered in the name of the exhibit owner, provided, however, that any animal entered in a youth fair, youth exhibit, or 4-H show or exhibition may be entered in the name of the exhibitor.
- (b) Exhibits shall have been owned by the exhibitor for a period of at least 30 days prior to entry of the exhibit, provided, however, that any snimal exhibit entered in a youth fair, youth exhibition, or 4-H show or exhibition shall have been in the care of the exhibitor for a period of at least 60 days prior to entry of exhibit.
- (c) Proof of ownership of all exhibits shall be provided by the exhibitor, upon request, to the fair sponsor
- (d) The fair sponsor may limit the number of breeds shown by an exhibitor

350.10 Rejection or refusal of an exhibit

Any fair society shall reserve the right to reject or refuse and to order the removal of any exhibit which, in the opinion of it board of directors, is not eligible or worthy of showing or has not met the livestock health requirements.

350.11 Compliance with an enforcement of livestock health requirements.

Each fair or exposition which receives money from the state pursuant to erficte 24 of the Agricultural and Markets Law shall comply with and enforce the livestock health requirements set forth in Part 351 of this chapter.

-HEALTH REQUIREMENTS-

351.3 General Houlth Requirements.

- (a) Animals demonstrating clinical signs or other evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases are not eligible for exhibition fairs.
- (b) The commissioner or an authorized agent may deny admission to, or require segregation or removal from, the fair premises of any animal affected with or exposed to any infectious, contagious or communicable disease.
- (c) Animals from the State that qualify for exhibition under the Part at one fair shall be considered to be approved for exhibitions at all other New York State fairs conducted during the same calendar year provided that the health status of the individual animal or the herd of origin does not change in the interim period.
- [d] All animals presented for exhibition that originate from a location other that his state shall meet all state importation regulations appropriate to the species in addition to the requirements of this Part. Examinations made to qualify outof-state animals after arrival in this state will not be accepted. State importation requirement can be obtained by contacking the Department at 1Winners Circle, Albany, New York 12235 (518-457-2886).
- (e) A fair may require proof that any animal being exhibited is actively immunized against rables with a vaccine appropriate to the species.

Equine Infectious Anamia Test (EIA/Coggins) - A valid EIA chart documenting that the animal has been tested (any USCA approved tast) within the current or previous calendar years (2012 and 2013 for this fair season) and found to be negative for EIA infection, is required of all equines 6 months of age and older. The animal identification notes on all accompanying documents must match the description on the official EIA chart.

The required certificate or statement shall include a complete identification of the horse, the date of the test and the name and address of the leboratory that conducted the test.

The certificate or statement must be signed by a duty licensed veterinarian, the director of the laboratory where the test was conducted or the chief animal health officer of the horse's state of origin.

Rables Vaccination - Proof of active immunization against rables required. Proof of rables vaccination will be required at all fairs for those species that a USDA licensed vaccine is available (as of 1/1/01 - cattle, cats, dogs, horses, ferrets and sheep). The vaccine must be administered at least 14 days prior to arrival on the fairgrounds but no greater than the liabeted time specified for active protection against rables. The animal's rables vaccination status must remain current throughout it's stay on the fairgrounds. Rables vaccination of all other mammalian species is strongly recommended. Some fairs may require rables vaccination of mammalian species not indicated on the labet. Please inquire locally. Local rables requirements will be enforced by state personnel.

Minimum age for Vaccination. Animals 150 days of age or older on the date of arrival at the fair must be vaccinated for rables (for those species requiring vaccination).

NOTE: Rabies titers inlieu of current rabies vaccination is not acceptable.

351.12 Segregation on return home. The owner or custodian shall keep show animals segregated from the herd flock for aperiod of at least two weeks.

351.13 Requirements Infair premium book

- (a) The forgoing requirements must be printed in each fair's premium book
- (b) No fair shall impose requirements in addition to, or different from those requirements set forth under this Part.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ALL GVBA CLASSES

Please read carefully before completing you entries

 All foals, yearlings, two and three year olds and Suitability and Conformation Hunter entrants (except entries in Class 107) must have been foaled in New York State or sired by a stallion standing in New York State. Broodmares do not have to be New York bred.

- 2. A Thoroughbred is any horse registered in any stud book recognized by the Jockey Club. A non-thoroughbred is any horse not registered as above. A half-Thoroughbred is any horse aired by a Thoroughbred stallion OR out of a Thoroughbred mare.
- A Non-Thoroughbred Horse is any literation pony-braditiosited in the tentory of the 31 counties of the GVBA
- 4. Horses are to be judged on conformation, quality, substance, and suitability to become, or in the case of dams, apparent ability to produce or beget hunters (unless otherwise noted). Transmissible unsoundness only to be considered in case of dams or prospective sires and dams. Yearlings, two-year olds, and three-year olds are to be jugged for soundness.
- "Manners and Condition Classes" were originally designed to encourage farmerbreeders to employ sound feeding and management practices with their mares and young stock. Their purpose remains today. MARES should be well handled, carrying good flesh commensurate with the age and demands of their foals, feat immed, and presenting a total picture of health and good care. The excessively fat mare showing signs of having been kept indoors, blanket- od and handled in a manner contrary to sound breeding practices will be marked down. FOALS should show good growth. trimmed feet and a nice covering of flesh. They should be well handled, permitting the handler to load tem away from their dams, to pok up all four feet, and handle all parts of the body, head, poll, dock etc. The soft excess sively fat, unathletic foal is not desirable. YEARLINGS should show good growth; ribs should have a good covering of flesh - excessive fat is undesirable. Feet should indicate continuous care and frequent trimming. Yearlings should stand and permit the handling of their feet, head, and tail. The handler may be asked to move the yearling out of place at a walk in a straight line and return to place jogging on a loose line. Yearlings MUST be shown in chiffney bits or bridle
- 6. The administration of tranquilizers and other medication to any animal shown at this show is forbidden. Eachewhiter makes entry with the knowledge of this prohibition and agrees that any horse shown under his name their the discretion of the judge or managing committeet may be examined for the presence of such medication by surine/blood test. The presence of drugs in the animal's blood and/or unine will disqualify the horse in question and all horses entered in the name of subject owner, from the payment of premiums, and all trophes and ribbons with will be returned to the Genesee Valley Breeders Association upon demand. A positive.
- sample will be cause for suspension from the Genesee Valley Breeders Association.

 7. Show management reserves the right to cancel, combine, split or reschedule any classes.

- 8. BREEDING DIVISION. Exhibitors are warned that all persons entering the ring must

be suitable affired and neal in appearance. Failure to observe this rule will be cause for the disquarticetion of the entry and forfeiture of the entry (see . Children under 14 rears shall not be permitted in the ring except in the mounted or Junior Handler classes.
